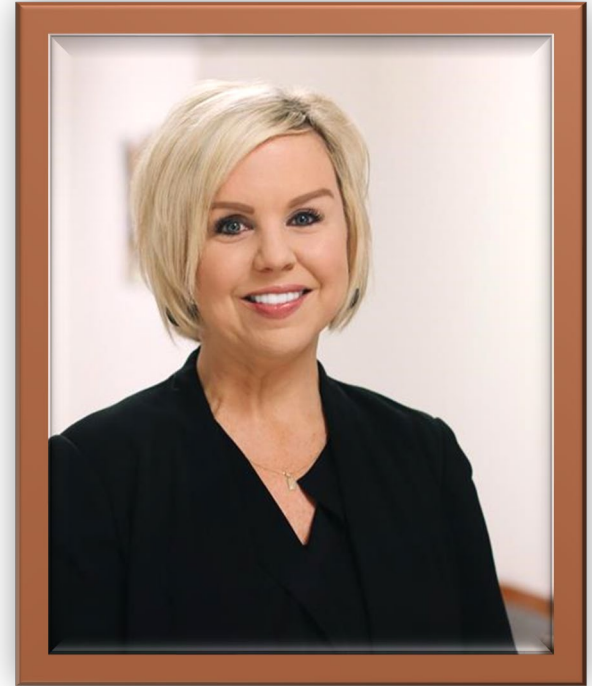

# ASVAB Testing and Data Reporting

- LEAs with students in 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade must provide an opportunity to take the [Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery](#) test
- Must be during normal school hours
- Must be a time that limits conflict with extracurriculars
- Must communicate [date, time, and location](#) with students and parents
- Alternate test may be provided if it
  - Assesses student's aptitude for careers not requiring postsecondary education
  - Is free to administer
  - Requires minimal training to administer
  - Provides results for students to explore careers aligned to interests and skills and develops strategies to attain the careers
- Must report offering in PEIMS Fall Submission

# FAFSA, TASFA, & CSS Profile

- 2025-26 FAFSA and TASFA will go live in December
- Currently, the [2025-26 FAFSA Prototype](#) is available for users to navigate types of scenarios they may encounter with actual FAFSA



# Graduation Requirements

- Endorsement Changes effective August 1, 2024
- Students **“who entered high school prior to the 2022-2023 school year”**
  - Coherent sequence of courses or program of study
  - Addition of Career Preparation I, II, and Project-Based Capstone so long as the course addresses the career field belonging to the related clusters
- Students **“who entered high school in the 2022-2023 school year or later”**
  - Courses required to be designated a CTE Completer in one of the **[listed]** TEA-approved programs of study



## Class of 2023 CCMR Outcomes Bonus Early Counts Released

The [Early CCMR OB Counts by District 2023 Graduates](#) has been filed on the [Performance Reporting Resources](#) page.

Early counts will be integrated into the Legislative Payment Estimates column of the 2024-25 SOF and paid throughout the year.

Once THECB data is processed in spring 2025, the Final CCMR OB Counts by District 2023 Graduates file will be released and integrated into the District Planning Estimates column of 2024-25 SOF. Districts can expect to settle up in September 2025.



# 2024 Accountability

- A-F Accountability is still pending per the lawsuit
- Data, Reports, and Downloads without A-F ratings and scale scores are available to authorized users in TEA Login Accountability application
- 2024 State-level and Region Accountability Reports are available on Performance Reporting page, updated today



# IBC Fall Submission Reminders

- Report all IBC results from June 1- August 31, 2024
- Some IBCs require no second step to earn and can be entered as **Earned** with the documented passing of an exam (held locally)
- Others require additional steps such as fingerprinting, background checks, submitted applications, etc. Research each certification!
- Each student can earn multiple IBCs, but the district can only be reimbursed for one per student over their entire high school career.
  - Have a process to manage this; the system does not alert you if a student has already been tagged for reimbursement.
- A district can be reimbursed for a passed or earned exam but not for a failed one.
- You must enter the cost in your student information system to gain reimbursement. Once the window for submission closes, there is no opportunity to correct for reimbursement or accountability.

  - **CTE Teacher Candidate:** individual who has experience working in a technical area but does not necessarily have a degree and is working toward a CTE teaching degree, workforce and development courses, certifications, or professional development

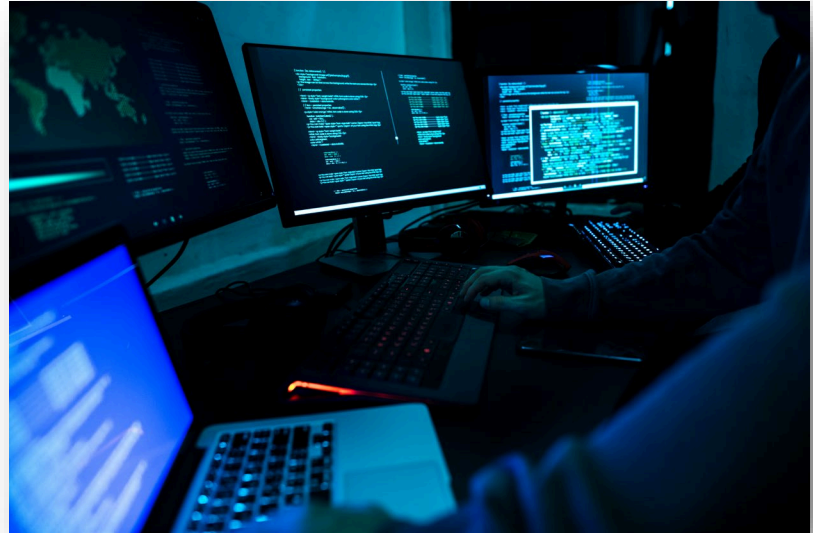

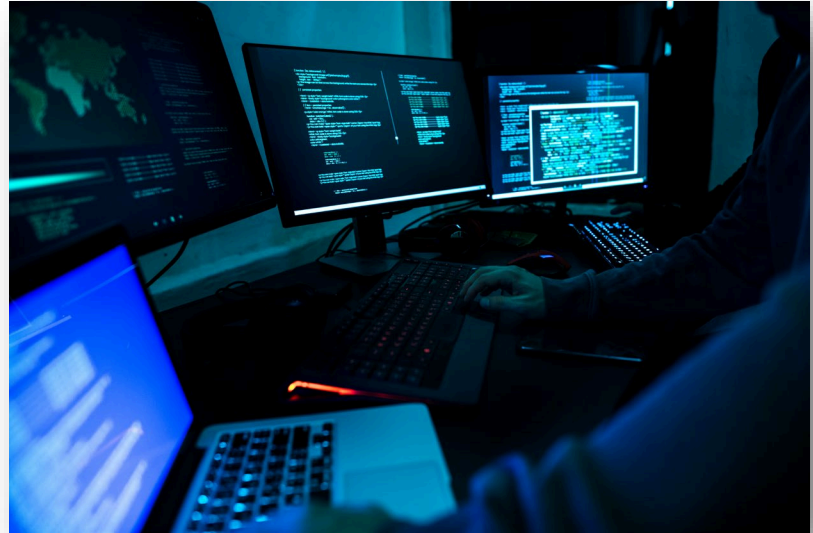
# New AP Program: Career KickStart

**Summer 1: YJA Summer Institute**
